

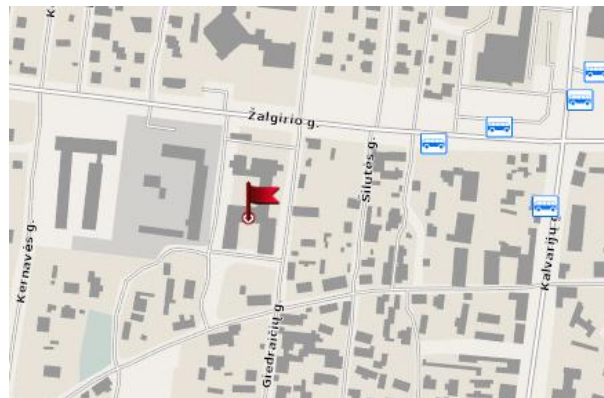

PI Computer program training
center (kpmc) is center for

vocational training, which is SME started at 2000y. It's engaged in adult vocational training, trains about 1000 people a year. KPMC offers courses, formal and non-formal, in computing, computer design, accountancy, business administration, management, secretarial skills, basic enterprise skills, languages, law etc. It has a track record in VET training and is familiar with VET education practice and problems in Lithuania. Center is licensed to give trainings and test knowledges for ECDL.

Team of teachers is at highest qualification level so that they can provide the trainings and courses at highest level.

Trainings takes place in a modern building very close to Vilnius center, which is adapted to theoretical and practical training. Classes are installed with all the needed learning equipment. Computer training takes place in modern 21 laptop installed classroom.

In the end of the training courses participants receive qualification certificate.

The aim of KPMC is to improve the employability skills of people of disadvantaged groups. These groups include women

returnees to the labour market, migrants, young people taking their first steps into employment, those living in rural areas and other socially isolated groups. KPMC seeks to increase employability of these groups through the raising of self-motivation and self-confidence of learners, using innovative pedagogical methodologies. Recently KPMC became active on the field of employability raising of people with mental health problems through vocational training.

We collaborate with a lot of organisations in organising work places for practice of our learners.
